

One of the best things about District 28 for me has always been that it is an international organization.





Communication & Leadership Award

Presented to Tamara Kowalska

Tamara Kowalska is the founder and Executive Director of the Windsor Youth Centre (WYC), a drop in centre for homeless and at risk youths in Windsor Ontario. She came across the idea after a perspective changing experience with a young woman asking for a glass of water. A simple exchange led to the idea, then the reality, of a place young people could go to have a hot meal and a safe space for a few hours every evening. She will share her communication and leadership experiences in the development and ongoing growth of the centre and ask us how we can use our own skills to better our communities.

Tamara earned her BA of ED from Boston University and is a thesis away from her Masters of Communications and Social Justice at the University of Windsor. Prior to starting WYC she was a teacher for 12 years, leading classrooms in Canada, The United States and Asia. For 6 of those years she lived in Korea where she taught media literacy at the University.

One of the current projects undertaken by the youth at WYC is, "Almost Home - We're almost Home, help us get there" a short documentary film outlining the reality of "What is home?" for the youth that frequent the centre and how influential the experiences at WYC are on their lives. This project, like so many others, was created on site at WYC in the dedicated arts studio where Tamara and her staff encourage their guests to fully use their voices in positive and creative ways.

This is a pivotal year for the WYC, as Tamara seeks to secure core funding for the centre. She also continues to grow the services available for the youth that have come to call the centre home. She has partnered with the Stephanie and Barry Zekelman Foundation to provide "The Student Success Program", with Steve Green to create a Community Garden that allows access to green space and with local theatre mentor, Chris Rabideau, to bring creative outlets and youth justice awareness for everyone involved with WYC.

According to Tamara, "I started WYC because there was a need for it. I take big leaps of faith every day. Five years later there's still a need, a bigger need actually and bigger leaps of faith to take."

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TOASTMASTERS

The History of District 28

District 28 was formed in 1947, and was honored that same year by a visit by founder Dr. Ralph Smedley to club #404 in Grand Rapids, MI. The District originally consisted of Toledo, northwest Ohio, and southwest Ontario west of Chatham, and the entire State of Michigan. District 28 grew, and in 1958 the District was divided to create District 62, which encompasses most of Michigan and Lambton County (Sarnia) in Ontario. The current District 28 alignment includes Toledo and northwestern Ohio; southeastern lower Michigan, including Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, Monroe, and Lenawee counties; and Essex and Chatham-Kent Counties in southwestern Ontario. From a total of about 40 clubs in 1958, the District has grown to include 126 clubs as of July 1, 2016.

District 28 has produced two International Presidents (Charles Mohr and Terry Daily) as well as several members of the International Board of Directors. Through August 2015 we have achieved Distinguished District status or better 22 times, and earned the Excellence in Leadership award in 2000, 2006-2009 (for three or more successive years as a Distinguished District). We achieved Select Distinguished District status in 2007-2008. In 2006, District 28 became the first in the world to create its own Strategic Plan to complement Toastmaster International requirements. The Plan received the endorsement of World Headquarters and the suggestion for other Districts to take a similar approach.

The District has hosted the International Convention once, in 1956. We have been honored with Presidential visitations on several occasions, including Tom Richardson in 1988-89, Neil Wilkinson in 1994, Len Jury in 1998, Gavin Blakey in 2002, and Jana Barnhill in 2009. Presidential citations have been awarded to Charles Mohr in 1978, Harry Merigian and Robert Lathrup in 1983, Ben
