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- The other part of the district mission is helping clubs achieve excellence.
- Last year we had TLIs in Toledo, Dearborn and Chatham. No make-up TLI in Dearborn because not enough attendance. There were make-up TLIs in Macomb county and Toledo. 8 clubs had 7 officers trained; 9 clubs had 6 officers trained. 101 clubs (81% participated).
- Winter TLIs numbers are different. Chatham TLI was postponed due to weather. 51 clubs with 4 or more officers trained. Out of 124 clubs, 87 (70%) participated.
- No actual distinguished clubs yet because it's not yet April 1; however, there are 60 possible to be distinguished. Some clubs have the goals but need the membership.
- Contest season lessons learned will be gone over. This year we had Table Topics contest in addition to the International Speech; next year (inaudible).
- Additional workshop coming up in April on Parliamentary Procedure at Schoolcraft College.
